The Northward Expansion project in the 1970's took all focus to the industrial lakefront and we found ourselves out of the residential market. Business Manager Bob Lauer knew it would take an increase in membership and a group of young, dedicated men to take back the residential market. From 1979 to 1982, Local 697 brought in and quickly trained over 100 men for this mission. The new hires went to school for 6 weeks unpaid followed by 6 weeks in the field where they were paid five dollars a day. The three months of dedication labeled this group of guys the "90 Day Wonders". Local 697 took back the residential market and still dominates it to this day. As the 90 Day Wonders have now reached 40 years of dedicated service to our industry, IBEW Local 697 would like to recognize them for their tour of duty and continued loyalty. ### THE HISTORICAL TIMELINE OF THE IBEW IN NORTHWEST INDIANA

#### . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . . .

THE FIRST IBEW LOCAL IN NORTHWEST INDIANA WAS LOCAL 280 – GARY, IN CHARTERED ON JUNE 1, 1902. IT LASTED 17 YEARS AND WENT DEFUNCT ON JUNE 1, 1919 JUST AFTER THE END OF WORLD WAR I.

#### •••••

LOCAL 571 WAS CHARTERED IN HAMMOND, IN ON JULY 1, 1907 AND LASTED JUST OVER 3 YEARS GOING DEFUNCT IN AUGUST OF 1910.

#### •••••

LOCAL 622 WAS CHARTERED IN CROWN POINT ON JUNE 20, 1908 AND ONLY LASTED 9 MONTHS GOING DEFUNCT IN MARCH OF 1909.

LOCAL 697 WAS CHARTERED IN HAMMOND ON JUNE 2, 1911.

local 652 was chartered in hammond, in on march 16, 1918 and went defunct 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  years later in november 1921.

LOCAL 478 WAS CHARTERED IN VALPARAISO, IN ON OCTOBER 3, 1919. IT WAS AMALGAMATED WITH LOCAL 697

LOCAL 91 WAS CHARTERED IN EAST CHICAGO, IN ON APRIL 24, 1934 DURING THE DEPRESSION. IT LASTED ALMOST 6 YEARS GOING DEFUNCT ON FEBRUARY 28, 1940.

#### LOCAL 550 WAS CHARTERED IN GARY, IN AS A MAINTENANCE LOCAL ON JULY 9, 1937. IT WAS AMALGAMATED INTO LOCAL 697 ON JANUARY 1, 1949 (AND LOCAL 697 THUS BECAME KNOWN AS GARY/HAMMOND)

LOCAL 1170 WAS CHARTERED IN KENTLAND, IN ON MARCH 1, 1945 AND WENT DEFUNCT ON DECEMBER 30, 1946.

#### .....

LOCAL 1440 WAS CHARTERED IN GARY, IN ON DECEMBER 17, 1952. AND WENT DEFUNCT ON AUGUST 16, 1955.

#### ••••••

LOCAL 2082 WAS CHARTERED ON JULY 1, 1960 AND WENT DEFUNCT ON JULY 18, 1972.

#### ••••••

LOCAL 697 WAS GIVEN JURISDICTION IN NEWTON COUNTY IN THE EARLY 1960'S AND CEDED THE PORTER COUNTY JURISDICTION TO LOCAL 531.

#### .....

LOCAL 2186 WAS CHARTERED IN HAMMOND ON OCTOBER 1, 1965 AND COVERED MEMBERS WORKING AT THE MEADE ELECTRIC MOTOR/MAGNET AND MACHINE SHOPS. IT WAS AMALGAMATED INTO LOCAL 697 ON JULY 1, 1988.

#### •••••

IN DECEMBER OF 2010, LOCAL 697 RELOCATED TO A BRAND-NEW, STATE-OF-THE-ART, LEED GOLD FACILITY IN MERRILLVILLE, IN THAT CURRENTLY HOUSES THE LOCAL 697 UNION HALL, APPRENTICESHIP SCHOOL, HEALTH & BENEFITS OFFICE AND CREDIT UNION.
